There will be a second collection today for the Black and Indian Mission, the oldest national collection of the Church in the U. S. The parishes on the reservations in the West, in the inner cities of Mississippi, in the isolated wilderness of Alaska are among the poorest and neediest in the land.

Last year your contributions meant that over 8 million dollars were collected; 132 dioceses received assistance.

A Reflection –

“THIS IS MY BODY ... THIS IS MY BLOOD ...”

“This Sunday the Church celebrates the mystery of Christ’s life-giving presence among us in the Holy Eucharist. In today’s scriptures, we find rich biblical images of blood. Blood suggests both death and life – vitality, health, and vigor. Without blood, one dies. In giving blood, one gives life. *[As we always remind for Holy Trinity’s blood drives!]*

In the Gospel, Mark also implies a New Covenant sealed by a new sacrifice. The evangelist places the supper on the day that Passover lambs were sacrificed and refers to the ‘blood of the covenant.’ He thus suggests that Jesus’ life-giving blood brings both a new relationship to God and new freedom: freedom from slavery to sin and death. The ‘blood of Christ’ offers new life with God and one another, given every Eucharist.”
